



## Still using these dangerous products?

As of January 1, 2022, Maryland banned all pesticides containing chlorpyrifos for ALL use in the state. Due to inadequate notification by Maryland Dept. of Agriculture's Pesticide Regulation department, farmers, orchards, golf courses, land care companies, schools, hospitals municipalities – and their workers, may be unaware of the ban and still using these banned products.

Chlorpyrifos is used on the production of fruits, including peaches, apples, pears, and strawberries, and many vegetables including sweet potatoes, broccoli, cabbage, kale, onions, and corn. Federal law bans chlorpyrifos use on all foods. In Maryland, all uses of chlorpyrifos have been banned.

It has been commonly used on golf course turf and in land care and exposure can occur when golfers, children, pets play on treated turf and track into homes on shoes. Chlorpyrifos drift during applications can affect anyone and be carried far through the air.

Health impacts from chlorpyrifos exposure includes brain-damage in children, learning disabilities, pediatric cancer, ADD/ADHD, neurological damage, asthma, Parkinson's disease, and more. It is the second most toxic pesticide for bees and causes harm to wildlife and aquatic life.
